10. CESA Report

We were saddened, but not surprised, to read the results of the latest UK census which show a steep decline in the number of professing Christians. Between the census in 2001 and the one in 2011 there were four million less people identifying themselves as "Christians". This is a cause of deep concern to evangelicals, but we do need to point out that there was no clear definition of the term "Christian". The question is how are we to stem the tide? How much we need to plead with God to show His grace and mercy on this unworthy nation.

The problem starts with something as seemingly insignificant as the promise made by Scouts and Guides. The Guides traditional promise was "To love God, serve other people and to keep the Girl Guide law", but now the powers that be want to remove any reference to God!

Then we have had the debate about same-sex marriage. Thank you to all those people who wrote letters or spoke to their MP. Sadly, the Prime Minister chose to ignore the voice of the people, or his own MPs, and forced through the legislation, but the fight is not over yet!

The first Sunday in February was "Values day" and our subject was "Lifting the Cloud of Disability". This is a subject which challenges our perception of disability in the Church. Thank you to the charity "Through the Roof" for their magazine.

Many committee members have written challenging articles for "Contact" and we are grateful for these.

Thanks also to all Churches who support us financially. A list of the recipients is included in the financial report.

Home Missions Department Report

Never before in the life of our denomination has there been such a need for mission within our churches. A challenge set recently by Steve Karma in Committee and at the Half Yearly Meetings is that we have reached a point where, if what we do in our day-to-day church life cannot be described as 'missional' then we ought to consider whether it should have any place within our church programme. The same could be said about our circuit and Union activities, including Conference.

In the last 18 months, members of the Home Missions Committee, supported by others throughout the denomination, have sought to sit alongside churches, where invited, to support, encourage and pray. This has been especially evident where a church has lost a minister or leader of many years and has been seeking God's direction for its future. Other churches have called upon our help because they have been struggling in some way, or have simply welcomed another 'point of view' as they seek God's plan for their future.

I have been so pleased at the response of many of our church members to God's call upon their lives as we have sat alongside them. However, they often need our continued support, encouragement and prayers. Subsequently, the work of the DOC (Andy Wilcock), Youth Worker (Martin Ludbrook), Tutors (Ady Rugeruza and Geoffrey Lee) and the Home Missions Committee members continues to grow because of our people following God's calling on their lives and the need for continued support and training. This excites us and is necessary if we are to stem the decline of our denomination.

Changing direction, listening to God's calling and stepping out in mission can be challenging and not a little frightening. The Home Missions Committee is proposing to develop a template that can guide and support our churches in what it means to be 'missional' in all we do in our church and denominational life.

So here we are to help. We are here to pray and work with you. Please let us know how we can help you.

By the way, we would welcome your encouragement, prayers and any financial gifts to fund the ever-increasing workload of the Home Missions Department.

Report by the Development & Outreach Consultant

I count it a wonderful privilege to be involved with so many churches, meeting people and hearing how God is working in their churches. The Excited about Mission prayer letter is reaching at least 280 people and that's before they pass it on to their friends. These stories are a source of great encouragement, as we hear of non-Christians getting the opportunity to hear the gospel message and of how they are responding to its call. We need to remember that for evangelism to be affective; non-Christians must hear the gospel message and see the gospel at work in our lives. Our prayer needs to be that the Holy Spirit will do a work in the lives of these people, revealing Jesus to them, through the words they hear and the things they see in our lives.

Earlier in the year I attended a 24 hour conference, organized by the Rural Evangelism Network. The theme was 'How do we bring the challenge of the gospel into our everyday activities?' I would love to hear and chat about the challenges you are experiencing in communicating the gospel to your local community. Please do get in touch.

Global Vision, Local Insight, Personal Touch

As I write this report, the final plans are all in place for the Away Day, but as it hasn't happened yet, a full report will be given at Conference.

It is encouraging that we are privileged to present a new name to be added to our List of Mission Personnel. To those of you who were at Conference at High Leigh in 2010, Sarah Armitage will not be an unfamiliar name. She joined us at that Conference and gave us a wonderful presentation on the situation in Burma and the work which she was involved with as part of Partners Relief and Development. She is now working as UK Director for this organisation, is a member of our Mexborough Church and is travelling around the country bringing the plight of the children to the forefront of attention in both church and government situations. We are pleased to add her name to our list. Sadly, that is not the only change, because of the fact that Helen Grimshaw has returned home from Latvia due to some health problems which made the climate in Latvia very difficult for her. Please pray that God will reveal His will for her back in England.

It is also really good to see that some of the projects that we have been involved with over the years are coming to fruition.

- The Shalom Birthing Clinic in Manila was dedicated to the work of the Lord in November 2012 and will be used as a state of the art Birthing Home and teaching centre for midwives, by the time you read this report. When I last spoke to Mavis Orton, the money to complete the work had been given and the finishing touches were being put on the building.
- Last week, I received a letter from Wycliffe to say that the Warji gospel of Luke had just come off the press; it has been recorded in audio and is being produced on CD and solar powered MegaVoice players (similar to Proclaimers). The JESUS film has been produced and "reading and writing books" in the language are almost ready.

How good it is for us to have been involved with two such special projects and to know that both of them will have benefits way into the future that we will never be able to measure.

This year we have also launched our OM Newsletter which is being sent out to all of our churches. We try to time them so that they can be sent in the mailings from Church House. We would love to hear your comments about this and your ideas. If there is anything in particular you would like to see in it, please come and visit us at the OM stand.

Our project this year is on a new continent – South America, Bolivia, to be precise and we will be partnering with Latin Link. An amazing and informative display is on the OM stand – please do come and see.

Please keep praying for our Personnel – it is a tough world out there and particularly where some of them are working. They need our prayers. Please let us know if you would like to receive prayer letters as we receive them (to do that, you need to have an email address). Thank you for your continued support for this work – we will announce the results of the Proclaimer project during Conference.

- Away Day has now taken place and was a wonderful day, impressed by the dedication of those working for the three organisations. MAF, AWM and Wycliffe Bible Translators. Learnt about use of mobile phones, Skype and Facebook to bring people together. A gift of £230 was given to each of the organisations from funds raised on the day in addition to the £500 previously agreed.
- Jan demonstrated a "Proclaimer" to us and told us that £5,324.90 has so far been raised and the funds will purchase machines for use in Ethiopia.
- Apolo Project is in Bolivia. Bolivia is four times the size of UK with one sixth of the population 67% under 30 with large families. Full details of the project will be supplied to Churches very soon.
