We go in once each half term and share a dramatized Bible story in assemblies for bot Infant and Junior sections of the school; we follow the Open the Book programme. This works through some of the major stories of the Bible to tell the big story of God and His people. We would recommend the programme to any churches wanting to take God's Word into their local school – Open the Book is now operating under the wing of The Bible Society and you can find details on their website (or we would be happy to help if we can).

Just before Christmas the school asked if they could use our church for the school choir to present a short concert of Christmas music. We were glad to welcome them and their families for this event.

In the weeks running up to Easter we will be holding another series of Ladies' Nights, using Becky Manly Pippert's "Know" course. We have been much encouraged by the response to the "Live" and "Grow" courses run previously and by what God is doing in women's lives as a result. So we are praying that God will continue to use His Word to change lives during the coming sessions.

We are also planning to have an exhibition of prints by Jenny Hawke called "One Friday"; the prints represent the stations of the cross and are produced by CPO. We plan to open the exhibition to the local community on Easter Saturday morning, with refreshments; there will also be opportunity for the prints to be viewed following an Easter Concert being given by the City of Sheffield Teachers' Choir on Saturday 8 April (which will include Stainer's "Crucifixion") and after our Easter Sunday service.

We are planning a craft day on April 1st.


We are also in the planning stages for Men's breakfasts for growth of our young men. Also working on ways to outreach to women we are already in contact with.
