
FIRE SAFETY

By Road

From Junction 28 of the M1 - Take the A38 dual carriageway towards Derby. Leave the A38 at the marked exit for the A615 Matlock/A61 Chesterfield and then take the B6179 towards Swanwick and Ripley at the roundabout. At the traffic lights in Swanwick turn left towards Somercotes (B6016), then 500 yards down the road turn right into Hayes Lane. The Conference Centre is straight ahead.

From Matlock - From the A6, take the A615 from Crown Square, Matlock, heading for Alfreton. Turn right at the top of the steep hill in Oakerthorpe, then left approximately 50 yards further on. At the junction of the A615 with the A61 in Alfreton, turn right. Go straight ahead over the traffic island, following the A61 signs for Swanwick and Ripley. At the traffic lights in Swanwick turn left towards Somercotes (B6016), then 500 yards down the road turn right into Hayes Lane. The Conference Centre is straight ahead.

From Derby - Take the A38 out of Derby towards Mansfield. Turn off on to the A61 signposted Matlock and Chesterfield. At the roundabout, turn right onto the A61, signposted Ripley and Swanwick. At the traffic lights in Swanwick turn left towards Somercotes (B6016), then 500 yards down the road turn right into Hayes Lane. The Conference Centre is straight ahead.

By Train

Our local British Rail Station is Alfreton Station on the Sheffield/Nottingham Line, although trains are limited. It is about three miles from the Hayes Conference Centre, but there is a plentiful supply of taxis at reasonable rates. It may be easier to travel to Derby Station, and then catch a bus or taxi from Derby.

By Bus

From Derby, take the 91 or 92 to Mansfield, and ask to be dropped opposite "The Gate" in Swanwick. From there, walk down Hayes Lane, and the Conference Centre is straight ahead.

23. Home Missions and YPD Report Report by Mr Cliff Darby

Most of the time of the Home Missions team over the past two years has been taken up with encouraging and supporting churches around the Union as they seek to discover whether God might be guiding them to seek to appoint an Area Worker.

As a result, meetings have been held with a number of churches, particularly in the Brackley and East Midlands areas.

As a result of these meetings and the prayers that have gone alongside them, we are now in a position to start to advertise for a suitable person in at least one and perhaps both of these areas. At the same time, there are discussions continuing among a number of other churches seeking to move in the same direction.

These are times of great change within our denomination, and there is a very real sense that now is the time to step out in faith – something we are often not too strong at.

Safeguarding is still high on the agenda of discussion points and there is always an open door for anyone who wishes to receive help and direction on this subject.

The work we have been doing on safeguarding originated with the YPD committee, but over time it has become clear that there is actually a much wider call on the resources and support than solely within the bounds of youth work.

Because in YPD this has for some time been the main topic of discussion, it had been agreed that, for a period at least, we will combine the meetings of these two committees. This is made easier since there is a large overlap of personnel between the two of them.

We live in challenging time, and all of those who are involved in either home missions or youth work greatly value your prayers.

24. Housing for Retired Ministers Fund Report

Firstly, as always we would like to thank all those who have prayed for or given to the work of the Society over the past year, whether individuals, churches or circuits.

At the beginning of the year we were supporting 8 ministers and 4 widows. There have been some changes during the past 12 months. Rev. John Williams was called home to glory – we give thanks for his long and faithful ministry and of course we continue to support Dorothy. In addition, two of our ministers reached the age where they are eligible to receive gifts. This means that at the end of the year we are supporting 9 ministers and 5 widows.

Annuities were made at the same rate as the previous year. We have received many emails, letters and telephone calls thanking us for the gifts. In some cases the annuitants have moved away in retirement and so our quarterly letters assure them that they have not been forgotten.

You will note from our financial report that the balance of funds has once again reduced. Interest received is still significantly lower than several years ago and donations from churches continue to be much lower than they were, understandably as the number of churches has reduced. We have been able to continue to give generously, largely due to a substantial legacy received but the balance of this gift is falling rapidly and soon will be used in its entirety.

Finally, during the year Emma Wilcock was also called home to glory – she was a very supportive Board Member for many years for which we are most grateful to God.
