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When Daniel was a little boy he was busy amusing his baby brother.
Mummy was busy in the kitchen and she could hear them playing. Suddenly all went quiet, the sound we really don't want to hear when children are playing.

Mummy waited for a moment and then she called, "Daniel".

There was no reply. She tried again, "Daniel, come here". The silence continued for a moment and then a small voice said, "I am here".

Here is a difficult concept for a 3 year old who is just coming to grips with the language. We explain to children that 'here' is where we are now, then we ask them to 'come here'.

We can think of here as our home. The place we feel safe. Home is where the heart is.

I got to thinking of the disciples who left their homes to follow Jesus. How did their wives cope? It is never easy for a family with no man at the head, but 2000 years ago in Israel it was almost impossible, shameful even.

Jesus was asking a lot of these men but he was asking even more of the women they left behind. The wives who really must have wanted to say 'come here, come home'. Managing without a wage coming in, without a man to speak for them. Children without the strong influence of a father. How those women must have struggled.

As I have watched the news in recent weeks I have seen pictures of families separated by war. Men putting their wives and children on a train and then staying behind to fight for their homes. Women having to care for their children alone, until hopefully they will be reunited.

Without those people who, through the generations, were willing to leave their homes and tell the gospel story, the word would never have spread, and we would be left out of the promise of salvation.

Jesus told us to store up riches in Heaven as we always have our heavenly home. What wonderful reassurance we have as Christians, and the knowledge we have that when the time comes God will say, 'Come here' and we will know exactly where HERE is.

NATIONAL SPIRITUAL COORDINATOR



Recently I accepted the role as the Wesleyan Reform Union's National Spiritual Co-ordinator. After time in prayer, we believe the Lord told us that He is not finished with our denomination. But our churches have to be filled with people who actually love Jesus and that we ought to love each other.

1 Peter 1:22 says "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart." That word "fervently" means enthusiastically or passionately! Is that what defines us? Can we begin to imagine what our Churches would look like if this kind of selfless love was on display at all times.

In the Gospel of John 13:34-35 Jesus said "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." That is how the world should see the Church, as a shining beacon of love.

There are three areas where we can be focussing upon in this role:

INTERDEPENDENCE; FOCUS; RE-ENGAGEMENT; I believe that the Lord has called us to bring to the fore a sense of interdependency amongst our Churches. There is a prevailing thought that the Union is an upper tier or level of management, and that it has no relevance to the people in our local Churches. Absolutely not! We ARE the Union and each of us have a part to play. We need to re-discover our sense of community both in our local churches and nationally. We want to help discover the gifts our Church family have in order to edify the local Church. Too many people attend church for many years and don't use those gifts. We lose so much when the body doesn't operate as a body. It is not just the Pastors who have gifts, we all have!

We have to learn again to "dare to believe." God is a great big God, He is a God of the impossible. If we are to grow, then we need to start daring to believe that He will make a way where there seems to be no way.

FOCUS

We need to focus on spiritual growth. We cannot grow numerically unless we grow spiritually. We can no longer just attend Church on Sunday and not be the church for the rest of the week, we all need to re-affirm our commitment to Christ's Church and do everything we can to serve Christ and one another and then share our faith simply within our communities.

We need to encourage our existing leaders, not only our Pastors, but those who lead our Churches, where a Pastor is not in place. We have to ensure our Pastors and leaders are equipped to do the job they are employed to do.

We also need to ensure that there is a better flow of information around our churches with regards to best practice, by making better use of our website and social media.

RE-ENGAGEMENT

The Bible tells us that we are not to forsake the assembling together of our Christian family. In the past two years we have learned so much about the different ways to communicate, and to do Church. But we are only strong when we are together.

I believe that this new role will bring opportunity to bring together a Union of Churches to work cohesively, effectively and in unity, that we might be the salt and light in our communities. I believe that we all have a part to play in the future of our Union, the body of Christ to which we belong, that we may share the hope that lies within us to an everdarkening world. Let us all dare to believe that God is able to do mighty things, and that His promises are everlasting and true. Let us dare to believe that change will come if we put our whole trust in Him and in Him alone. And then put that love and faith into practice. God bless

THIS SERIES OF STUDIES IS BEING PREPARED FROM A BOOKLET ENTITLED "READ MARK LEARN"

Study 1 — Mark 1:1-11 (Please read)

The Gospel of Mark is regarded as the oldest of the gospels. Information seems to suggest that it was written by John Mark between AD65 and AD75. The word Gospel means Good News, and these eleven verses tell us two main things about it.

First it was preached by John. What a wonderful gospel it was and still is. "the forgiveness of sins", verse 4. When God forgives a person's sins they are wiped out and done away with. That was true from the beginning of time and still is true today. Jeremiah chapter 31 verse 34 says "I will forgive their wickedness and remember their sins no more. But notice that before a person can be forgiven there has to be repentance (verse 4). To repent is to change one's mind about something, but not only changing one's mind but changing one's behaviour and attitude. To change the way we live. In the case of sin, it means to turn one's back on it completely. Notice how Jesus linked repentance and the gospel in verse 15 (which comes in the next part of the study). Are you sure that you have obeyed His command? If so, then you can certainly claim God's promise.

Second it was provided by Jesus. The best news that the world has ever heard is "the gospel about Jesus Christ the Son

of God" (verse 1). John knew that he was preparing the way for someone "more powerful than I (verse 7). John was the messenger; Jesus was the Message! Jesus allowed Himself to be baptised by John, not because He had any sin of his own that he needed to repent (read carefully what it says in Hebrews chapter 4 verse 15), but to identify himself with sinful men. Verses 9 to 11 give us the account of the baptism Jesus, and here we see all three members of the Godhead together. Father Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus in the water, the Holy Spirit descending in the likeness of a Dove, and the Father saying" You are my Son whom I love; with you I am well pleased". The Son of God left the Glory of Heaven to be identified with us in His birth, His baptism, His life and above all in His death. For as Peter reminds us in! Peter chapter 2 verse 24 "He himself bore our sins in His body on the cross". Jesus was more than example; He took your place and mine in order to undergo the death penalty due because of our sin. He died that we might be forgiven! Take time now to rejoice in that wonderful fact!

"In Christ God forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32)

BUSINESS

The main items of news at Conference this year were-



The vote to convert the Union to a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) The appointment of the new Spiritual Coordinator for the Union.

The vote to convert to a CIO was unanimously carried and Rev. Michael Hedley was appointed as our new National Spiritual Coordinator.

Other items of news:

- General meetings will be held on the 3rd
 Saturday in October (except this year when it

- November), and the 1st Saturday in March (these meetings will replace the old General Committee and Half Yearly Meetings). Anyone is welcome to attend these meetings.

- Daphne Hodkinson stood down as the representative of CESA, after serving in this role for 16 years. Graham Johnson, Pastor of 'The Little Chapel' in Bedworth, will take over this role.

PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Our President George Philips led his devotional sessions from the Prophesy of Ezekiel Ch 47:1-12. His title was 'Back to the future', and 'Hope for the future'. George spoke under 4 headings:

Procession – All things depend on the source of the river, which is capable of giving life and sustenance, and this is only possible because the source is God himself. God had to be the source of redemption for Israel and eternally for humanity today.

Progression -How the river progresses. The church is always growing, every new person who accepts Jesus adds to the church of all time and builds on all those who have gone before. It is from this prophecy in Ezekiel that we see God's Word spreading today.

Purification – When the river enters the Dead Sea the water becomes fresh. Where the river flows everything will grow. God will renew all things, a new heaven and a new earth will be restored.

Provision – The fruit is a direct result of the



life-giving river flowing directly from God, the source. As we look back at the prophecy, we can look forward to the future. The message of the life-giving river that we have to proclaim is a provision on which our future rests.

CONFERENCE SPEAKER LOUISE MORSE PILGRIMS FRIENDS SOCIETY

Snippets from Louise's talk by Mike Young

What do you mean by "old"? Is 60 the new 40? If you didn't know your age how old would you say you are? What do you see when you look in the mirror?

These were a few questions Louise asked us to consider.

Old age is categorised in negative ways. Getting work over 45 is widely documented as being very difficult and ageism is common in many ways. Our society portrays being young as of upmost importance. Apparently the young spend more money and contribute more to the economy. This is not so!

The good news is God has a special purpose for older people. God designed old age and we need to change the perspective on aging. Older



people are revered in God's word.

Our inner self is being renewed day by day. Your inner value is the focus here. **Psalm 91 v 16 "with long life will I satisfy him and show my salvation."**

Being older means you will have much more experience than young people, be more relaxed and have more time to pray. These benefits can help you contribute in a softer yet more powerful way.

You can teach and encourage the younger generation, witnessing from experience and knowledge.

Young people grow up too quickly and because of the lack of experience make some bad choices. You are here to listen and mentor. We have all seen how children love spending time with older people. All part of God's design!

Psalm 78, Psalm 71, Psalm 145.

Louise has written several books. She specialises in cognitive behavioural therapy and her latest book is named "Dementia – Losing your mind doesn't mean losing your soul". Her message was to continue to give people spiritual support. The person remains so persist – pray and read the bible to them.

You do not have a "use by" date. Serve the Lord always and rejoice.

LETTER OF THANKS

Hello friends,

Well, you absolutely smashed your fundraising target! We are so delighted to have your support for this minibus project, and yet again I am personally reminded of God's faithfulness as well as a God who sees much further into the future than we do. One of the impacts of sanctions placed on Russia has been the significant rise of prices of many items, including cars and minibuses. We can clearly see in the total raised that God knew even this was coming.

I messaged Alina, who manages the Women's Crisis Centre, and this is what she said in response to hearing what you raised, "A huge thank you from us and our children for your kind hearts and support during this difficult time for everyone! Thank you very much! We couldn't have done it without your support!! God bless you and reward you a hundredfold!"

Since we started fundraising for this minibus the work on site has grown. We anticipate that it will continue in this direction as the needs of families in Russia increases due to increasing food prices and heightened anxieties causing rises in levels of addictions and domestic violence. A second building is now in use, a new group for girls from vulnerable families is exploring how to have safe relationships, and the Centre is reaching out to families in the community by running a free summer camp for children from their local town.

This work is so precious to us, empowering families who been through the most horrific experiences, supporting them through rehabilitation, and then equipping them to reach out to others. We know that having a minibus for the Centre will make this ministry even more effective.

Please continue to pray for our work, especially for our ability to continue getting our support out to those who need it most. I will rendezvous with Alina to pass on the funds for the minibus in August. Please pray for our safety and for wisdom for Alina and her husband Roma as they start shopping for the right vehicle for the Centre. We will keep you updated!

On behalf of us as a UK staff team, Alina and all the women and children she supports, thank you – we are so grateful.

BEACH MISSIONS REMEMBERED




